Head of Cabinet of Dragos Tudorache, MEP, co-rapporteur for the AI Act

Dragos Tudorache is the Renew Europe co-rapporteur for the AI Act in the European Parliament. As his Head of Cabinet, Dan Nechita covers the EU AI Act and oversees the artificial intelligence (AIDA), civil liberties (LIBE), foreign affairs (AFET) and security and defense (SEDE) legislative committees and the Delegation for relations with the United States (D-US). Previously, he was a State Counselor for Romanian Prime Minister Dacian Ciolos, with a mandate on e-governance, digitalization, and cybersecurity. He worked at the World Security Institute (the Global Zero nuclear disarmament initiative); at the Brookings Institution Center of Executive Education; and as a graduate teaching assistant at the George Washington University. He is co-founder of Smart Everything Everywhere, a think tank promoting European digitalization and founder of K Street Consulting, a boutique consulting company for U.S. companies in the EU. He is a graduate of the George Washington University (M.A.).

Patrick Raude

Secretary General of SACD

Patrick Raude graduated from the French National School of Administration (ENA), the National School of Posts and Telecommunications and ENS Cachan, and is a University Associate Professor of Economics and Management. He began his career in telecommunications and has international experience, having worked in Brussels and Japan. From 1997 to 2002, he worked at the Budget Directorate (Budget Ministry). Thereafter, he became advisor for media, film, cultural industries and digital affairs to the Prime Minister, until 2005, before being appointed Director of Media Development and member of ARCEP. He became in 2011 Director of regulation, relations with the State and European Affairs at the Française des Jeux (the French lottery operator). Since January 2016, he serves as Secretary-General of the SACD. He is also vice-chair of the SAA board of directors and vice-chair of CISAC board of directors.

Axel Voss

Axel Voss, MEP, rapporteur for the Legal Affairs Committee on the AI Act and former rapporteur of the 2019 Copyright Directive

Axel Voss (CDU) studied law at the Universities of Trier, Freiburg and Munich and has been working as a lawyer since 1994. From 1994 to 2000, he was a civil advisor at the EU Commission's representation in Germany. Afterwards, he worked for nine years as lecturer for European Affairs at the RheinAhrCampus of the College of Koblenz. He became a Member of the European Parliament in 2009. Axel Voss is the European People Party (EPP) coordinator for the Committee on Legal Affairs (JURI) as well as deputy member of the Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs (LIBE) and from 2020 to 2022 member and rapporteur in the special Committee on Artificial Intelligence. For the EPP, he was among others rapporteur for the 2019 Copyright Directive and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and is the rapporteur on the AI Act in JURI..
